Tee ball this year saw us struggle a little with numbers to start with but by the years end we had 27 little up coming baseballers. ### **Facilities Management Report**

As usual first contact with the club for this season was by way of the preseason working bees. We had 3 working bees prior to the commencement of the regular season. These working bees were well attended with the focus on the sand surfaces of diamonds 1 and 2 and the batting cages. At this stage little did we know of the battle with the weather we would have this season.

After many (10+) years of drought when we knew that after Christmas the ground would be rock hard, the grass would be brown and cutting would require minimal input, we had a fabulous 2009-10 when the amount of precipitation was a ground keeper's dream. This past season of 2010-11 saw the drought break and at least 4 times during the season we received 1 month's rainfall in a day. It showed that baseball diamonds are flat and don't have the grades to effectively disperse the rain water.

The wet conditions affected access to the diamonds on training nights and game days. All diamonds were flooded at least three times during the season and the infield on diamond one was regularly not available for training prior to Christmas to allow the ground to recover for the next games. Unfortunately some local primary schools don't consider others when using the grounds and damaged the fields twice during the season. An attendee to a nearby party one Friday night decided to try his luck by attempting some "donuts" on the diamond 5 outfield. The vehicle became bogged after half a revolution. The details of this event were brought to the attention of the police (thanks Arnie Walters) and Knox council to deal with the matter. The big wet never got the better of us and it was pleasing to see the great attendance to the impromptu working bees called to repair damaged playing fields and the change rooms after another flooding rain.

Notable changes and improvements undertaken in the past year are as follows:

#### Diamond 1 field

Filling and leveling of the granitic sand between infield and outfield grass that had washed away during the many rain storms.

Pre-season and mid-season work on the batter's circle and pitcher's mound to repair the wear and tear of play and maintain the levels and shape.

#### Diamond 1 home dugout

The drinking fountain and seating in the dugout were relocated to provide a safer space with improved access. A new wall was constructed between the dugout and the spectator area. This wall provides greater privacy for the players and also supports the helmet / glove shelves and the scoreboard. The loose weight system in the weights room was replaced by a safer fixed weights system.

#### **Batting Cages**

The batting cages and the adjacent training apron re-laid with new granitic sand. The batters, positions received synthetic grass mats. The protective screens had all the existing fencing and netting removed and replaced by conveyor belt rubber for

better protection. The frame of the mobile batting cage was straightened and braced and the netting fixed.

#### **Social Area**

Between seasons the old television was replaced by a wall mounted Plasma screen and a PVR to allow for replays of Major League Baseball games to be displayed as well as live games of other sporting codes.

#### Kitchen

The kitchen received a minor makeover to create a better workspace. The stove was removed to allow the drinks fridge to be placed against a wall. New kitchen appliances include: a microwave oven, a larger bain-marie and 2 food steamers for hotdogs and dim-sims.

#### Game Day setup

Time was spent with the Under 12 teams to assist and instruct parents with setting up of the field on game day. This includes critical dimensions as well and some peculiarities to do with diamonds 5 and 6. This allows the coaches to coach and maximise their time with the team.

While spending time out on the field pre-game I was often approached by visiting club members who enquired about the affects of the weather on the fields. Given what we have had to deal with they were always complimentary of the game day conditions and the diamonds looked fantastic with the lush grass coverage even though at times they were a bit soft underfoot.

The social area was well patronized during training nights and the senior players enjoyed the surroundings with the television on, the smell of hot food from the kitchen and a vigorous game of table tennis (the local version known as Sting-Pong) being played.

### 5ths - Season Report

This season saw the introduction of a fifths team playing in Division three alongside teams from Cheltenham (2), Doncaster (2), Blackburn, St Kilda, Fitzroy, Essendon and Preston (until they forfeited the remainder of the season in the final games prior to the Christmas break.)

The team for the most part was made up by a collection of new players to the club: Josh Melton, Kutay Dal, Damien Wallace and Leigh Dillon, with Glen and Darren Keech returning to UFTG for the first time since their junior days, some ten years earlier. The remainder of the team was for the most part made up by Glenn and Dylan Archer, Michael Gilbert and cameos from Chris Harman, Sharon Findlay and some handy juniors along the way. But early on in the season player numbers were the main issue for the side, and pitching stocks were limited for the most part, Darren Keech taking a lot of that burden and a heavy reliance on 14 year old Dylan Archer as the season wore on, who battled manfully given his young age.

The first month brought the side its only two wins for the season, an epic 16-15 win over Doncaster B and a solid (11-5) victory over the struggling Preston. There were some helpful contributions from higher-grade players during this time, notably pitchers Harman and Alex Oldriks as well as Scott Dean, Bob Simonton, Damien Sharp, Geoff Williams and Duncan McAlister.

As the season wore on the gap between top and bottom seemed to widen, the last points gained on the table were those from a 12-12 draw with Cheltenham TK on the 7<sup>th</sup> November, a long way from the season's end. Games where the UFTG side was competitive first time around produced one-sided results later in the season. There was a general consensus from the group however - that despite the scoreboard – there had been some real individual improvements, and that the team *itself* had really developed as a group and were in fact performing many of the simple baseball principles better than they had been at the start of the season. <sup>1</sup>There was probably a case for the side to have been registered in Division Four given the general inexperience of the group given the end result of last place (removing Preston's non finish to the season). In the last five games of the season the side gave up 99 runs to the opposition, whilst only managing 12 off their own bats. <sup>2</sup> Sprits did remain incredibly upbeat despite the win drought, and the group were as eager and optimistic for round 18 as they were for round one. They were confident of an upset all the way to the final out of the season.

Glen Archer was named a deserving MVP for the team.
