#### 3rds - Season Report

It certainly showed that we could be as good as anyone on our day.

Another memorable contest was the one game we played against the other grand final participant, Melbourne. In a match played in unseasonably cold and wet weather we allowed their leadoff batter in

#### Junior Development - Season Report
