President's Report

Well we are 50 and we celebrated such a momentous event with a great 50th Dinner Bash that was attended by about 140 members past and present. Each speaker gave us their insights into their eras in our illustrious history. Player Management Report

It was an interesting Season for my first year in the role of Chairman Player Management and gave me the opportunity to look at a number of processes and existing procedures within the Club.

The key responsibilities were: Player Selection:

- Selection of teams had no real issues week to week, although we can improve our communication to players when they are dropped by having the appropriate coach discuss with them the reasons. This was a bit spasmodic during the season but overall was managed okay.
- The club also blooded some of the younger players into the Firsts late in the year. This should also be looked at for the entire season where players are consistently performing well, or conversely, other players are not performing to standard. A key focus for the 2013/2014 season will be the selection of players based on performance rather than injuries or unavailability.
- A number of players from the Thirds and Fourths could also have been looked at for higher grades. It is proposed for the upcoming season that selection in general becomes more "performance" based and will be discussed with the Coaching staff.
- Thanks to all of the coaches this year for their effort and assisting me in understanding my role.

Assistant / Specialist Coaches:

- A coaching framework is being composed to assist the club in selection of the appropriate Senior and Junior coaches in discussion with the appropriate club personnel. This will include expectancies, operating guidelines and desired club requirements. This is not to say we have got this wrong, simply we are looking to ensure everybody involved is in sync with the club expectations.
- We were very late in the appointment of Senior and Junior coaches for the season and will be ensuring this is not repeated in the upcoming season. We will be seeking to appoint coaches for Teams and specialist coaches prior to the 2013/2014 pre season commencing.
 - More interaction will be required with the Junior Coaching staff next year.
 There is also consideration being given to a sub-committee to fulfil the role of Junior Development to support the Player Management and Coaches for the Junior sides. More information will be circulated shortly on this.

Player Management Report

- An increased focus will be made in 2013/2014 on specialised coaching for Pitchers, Catchers and specialised positions to assist all players at the club. This occurred at various times throughout the season but needs a more rigid framework so that players are aware and can attend sessions. Thanks again to those people who conducted group and individual session for players.
- Next season will be interesting from a number of perspectives, including the requirements for appointed coaches to be certified (as stipulated by Baseball Victoria).
- It is planned to have regular meeting of all coaching staff during the next season to discuss and cover all appropriate coaching points. This did occur this season but was a little fragmented.

Uniforms, Player Numbers, Training Shirts, Caps, Supporter Caps etc:

· There were no real issues with any of these points.

Scorer Recruitment and Education:

- Whilst scorers were appointed for the Firsts, the other sides had a number of Scorers throughout the season. This is not uncommon within Baseball. Suffice to say on any given week somebody scored to assist the club. Thanks to all of the scorers for the season and also to those that filled in at the last minute to help the club out.
- A session was proposed to be conducted for scorers during the season but did not occur due to low numbers. A night will be set down for the 2013/2014 season and notified via Facebook and email to all club members.

Umpire Recruitment, education and appointment:

- This was a very interesting season from an Umpire rostering point of view. Whilst the roster for the early part of the season seemed to work, there were a number of games during the balance of the season where umpires were not available, and the responsibility regularly falling to other club members or parents.
- The Club has stipulated that Umpires for Junior games must be over the age of 18, hence this leaves a reduced number of players available for umpiring. As a result some players did 2 or 3 games, whilst some did none. It is proposed next year to enforce the rule of failure to umpire on nominated days will result in not being available for the following game.

Player Management Report

- The Umpiring roster will be improved next year and will be more tightly managed and communicated, preferably on the Web page. There will be no valid reason for not knowing when you are rostered for Umpiring.
- It was also planned to perform an umpiring session for interested parties, and although this did not occur, it will be a prime focus for the 2013/2014 season along with appropriate certification. More details will be circulated prior to the commencement of the next season.
- A huge thanks to Denis, AJ, Cheesy and the parents that filled in to umpire for the Juniors. Thanks also to those that Umpired the Fourth's home games. John O'Halloran did most of the Third's games, so huge thanks John.

Other Duties that fell within the role of Player Management:

- Score Sheets being emailed to Baseball Victoria worked really well. There was only a few missing during the year and they were tracked down quickly. Thanks to all for providing these and it was pleasing to "not see" the UFTG on BV memos for missing score sheets too often.
- Stats sheets were a different matter. With the exception of a couple of coaches, very few stats sheets were received from coaches. This needs to improve next year along with Match reports which were pretty well non existent. To improve our communication and share our good news on ALL teams, we need to provide this info for all spectators and players and assist in selection when required.

Proposed Activities / Considerations for the upcoming 2013/2014 season are:

- A registration day for Juniors and Seniors with a BBQ to enable the club to gauge numbers and team nominations.
- A players meeting 3 or 4 weeks prior to the commencement of the Season, preferably during pre season training.
- A documented and approved selection process for the Club that all committee, coaches and players are aware of.
- · Players to sign the Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct as part of their registration.
- · A sub committee to be formed to address Junior Development.

 A mentoring program to be considered for identified junior players for mentoring by a Senior player (matched by the club) to assist in all facets of Baseball.

Summary

My first year in Player Management was a challenging one, and I would like to thank the members of the Committee for their support and clarifying responsibilities as and when required.

I would also like to thank Swanno and Phil Yule for their assistance during the year in providing comments back on the senior teams in relation to my role.

Finally, thanks to all of the club members, supporters, parents and their family for the support during the year and providing feedback off the field on selection of players, club attitude and club spirit – all with a view to improving this off the field so we as a club benefit on the field.

I look forward to 2013/2014 at UFTG.

Club & 1st Nine Report

The past season saw a rollercoaster of highs and lows for the First's. We are good enough some weeks to beat the 2 teams that ended up playing in the grand final, yet other weeks struggle and lose to teams finishing in the bottom 3 on the ladder. As the club coach it is my responsibility to lay the foundations and set the standards for an on field culture within the playing group. This culture should be of a standard demanding the playing group respect their team mates, the club and most importantly the game. I set a few things in place at the start of the year in the hopes of building towards creating this necessary culture. I decide at the start of the year the 1's and 2's players would vote on a 4 man leadership group who would assist the coaching staff in ensuring the core values and ethics were being delivered to and by the playing group. As stated in the voting process these players would not necessarily be the best players but those who would lead by example week in week out and pull the rest of the group up to their level of standard.

This group of players were a big help throughout the year and as in introductory season performed well in what we stated their role would involve. However I believe with a little more structure including more Players Only meetings, this group can have a far larger impact on the on field success of the club going forward, which I do believe this process should be kept in place and gave up and coming players something to strive for. A large part of the groups focus was to be on training days where they are to set the tone through their work ethic, which is an area that has seen this club struggle in recent times.

My unique situation sees me miss some training and game days due to my other Baseball commitments. Some of the feedback I received when absent on these days is something that I struggled to deal with. It is the reason that the Upwey Baseball Club does not push to make a finals appearance but instead battles to stay above the relegation zone. I get reports of a 1's player sitting in the dugout for the entire training session as it is too hot and watches the rest of the club train, there are players getting ejected from games while I am absent due to language or behavioural issues obviously not showing the respect needed, a player choosing to coach a junior TRAINING session as opposed to represent the club in an A Grade team playing a game on the same night and lastly reports of multiple players attending to play a game in a state clearly not fit to play due to the previous nights social events. These continual ongoing incidents make it a very difficult proposition to believe the playing group are buying into a culture needed to be a successful Baseball club. This is definitely a key part of the club's makeup that needs to be addressed. I see this Club having 2 options with the current state of players and depth. The first option is the club continues to battle through the years until success may finally come with the inevitable fact that players get bigger, better, faster and stronger with each year and hopefully success is not too far away. Yet this does not fix the behavioural, culture and commitment issues we see around the club. With these current issues presenting themself I was in a position this year to penalise players by form of a demotion giving opportunities to some younger players which is great for those guys, however to require an opportunity through another's punishment is not a great environment to create and sustain success. The issue

with this process is at the current state our depth is not as great as many other club's at the present time, therefore by punishing players it seems to put a risk on the current ability we have to compete in Division 1 which is ultimately the only place this club desires to be. This club does have enough talent to compete at the Division 1 level yet there are issues holding it back which we are now looking at.

The second option is to create a no nonsense policy which will enable over time this club to get back to where it once was, sitting at the pointy end of the Division 1 ladder year in year out. The issue with this option is the club has no other option but to stare straight down the barrel of a birth in Division 2 before the process will start to see results and see the club climb back up and work its way to a successful position. When sitting down at the start of the season and asking for what type of commitment the playing group wanted to give, there is no question the group had the desire to play Finals Baseball and seemed to understand what it was going to take. Family and Work come before our sporting commitments and that is something that shall always remain and rightfully so, however I see a continual list of events that keep players off the training track and missing games, when I come to find out times did not necessarily conflict or the reason in the first place did not stack up against what I would call committing to your teammates. Music festivals with your mates or a golfing weekend away I find a struggle to deal with from players in the 1's and 2's as you left the club and your other MATES struggling to find a way to win a ballgame. I understand players pay to play and if they can not commit then I understand, if they can only play 75% of games as their social life is important to them that's fine, although it needs to be established that this is a social club so there is no confusion between The Board, The Coaching Staff and The Playing Group.

With all this being said there are some positives that came from this season including the ability to recruit some new players into the club, something that is important to be successful in this league as every year we see clubs continually look outside to add depth to their list of talent. We saw younger players start to move into the 2's and 1's showing positive signs that future talent is here at our club and with continual development these players are our future. Most importantly the behaviour seen over the last 3 weeks of the year saw our 1's battle, compete and succeed in cementing our spot in Division 1 for at least another year, although if that same 3 week effort is match for 90% of a season they will see the team playing off in a Division 1 Finals Series.

A final thank you to the Board Members, in particular Bob and Denis for the ongoing support and also to my Coaching Staff in Donny, Mitch and Chris for the assistance over the past season and to all at the club who have helped over the past 12 months.

3rds - Season Report

The 2012-2013 summer baseball season for the threes was a relatively tough one when measured by success on the scoreboard. The recipient of the Most Valuable Player award for this season is Yarran Curtis. Against some big hitting opposition teams Yarran did a great job for us on the mound and was also one of the leading hitters in our lineup.

I would also like to thank on behalf of each player in the thirds everyone who scored and umpired our games, your efforts on game day are greatly appreciated.

It is glaringly obvious we must look at having the best possible Coaches working with our U12's then U14's up to U18's this is not to take away from the good work our Coaches did this season but we are not all talking the same thing and only producing confused player's so we must all be heading in the right direction.

I am disappointed with the lack of coaches who wanted to get up to date and do their Accreditation especially when it could be done at Upwey with no need to travel to another venue, in 2015 it is compulsory to have your Level 3 to coach junior's but at Upwey it should be a requirement to have the new Accreditation by next season (later this year) so it makes no sense not to have gotten it done.

Training session's for the most part were not to bad but could have been better with some age group's, some thing's I watched made me wonder how player's were expected to improve when we simply watched and made no comment to help the player and teaching things we can't do ourselves or fully understand it must be done better.

I believe that although I'm a State Coach I still have things to learn myself and I'm lucky that I am in a position where I'm involved in the Melbourne Aces Baseball Academy and State Program it allows me to continue learning, I've always said that if I get to a point that I know it all it's time to coach another sport so it is a fact that 1 or 2 coaches can't know it all and it's a huge mistake to teach something your not completely sure of especially now we have one approach to teaching the game in Australia from Club Ball to AA and AAA National Squad's so our coaches have to get up to date via the new Accreditation Program.

To our parent's some still must learn to simply watch the game and applaud good outcomes from our side and the other side and realise the players are doing the very best they can do so it doesn't help when parents say things like "run faster", "get a hit", "throw strikes" or sit there shaking their head when their child make an error, it's

important you support the players and weather you like it or not they are going to make error's, strike out and struggle throwing strikes so understand baseball is a game designed to make you fail.

Friday night Domestic Baseball must be taken more seriously by Parents and Players and I believe we need separate coaches not the guy's who coach on Sundays these Coaches could be Parents who get their Accreditation and other bits done, I believe it is time we made Domestic Baseball compulsory for all U12's, U14's and first year U16's and if we have to put 2 teams in the U15 Waverly Competition then so be it, understand the idea behind Domestic Baseball it is to give players the opportunity to Pitch, Catch and play other positions on the field they would not normally play on Sunday Mornings.

We know the other Clubs make Winning a priority but at Upwey with Domestic Baseball we are not interested in Winning our aim is Development and Fun, with players trying different positions because you simply never know what you will find. There were people throughout the season who complained about the main field along with diamond 2 and there were other issues and naturally it was the same people who found it difficult to clean up the field after their team played for the senior games that afternoon or put things away, my blunt message to those people is get **Your** job done right and don't complain or simply **Do It Yourself** because your not helping the Club or teaching your players good habits.

I know I have mentioned the new Accreditation Scheme a number of times but it is something I am passionate about simply as I know the new approach works and will develop batter player's and there is now 1 way to teach the game in Australia that is the important thing to have us all doing things the same way, Upwey can be at the forefront of Victorian Baseball again because I can do the Accreditations at the Club any time you want to do it so how much easier can I make.

We need to find a way to increase numbers in Junior Baseball and it's up our players and parents to help by putting the word out to their kid's mates by letting them know how great baseball is to play, even putting notices in the school New's letter will help raise the Club's profile so please help build the Club.

It is also time we ran a come and try day for Junior Baseball not just T-ball we cant expect T-balers to move up to U12 Baseball, we must find a way to increase our numbers at the U12 and U14 levels so a strong advertising campaign is required and I believe we still need a Junior Co-Coordinator as Roger and Myself are **NOT IT** we have enough to do so someone needs to stand up and take on the role.
